Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

I was lame recently myself after a bad fall. Most of you know that I had a bad fall and a week later my ankle became severely infected. I was told that a hematoma and abscess often takes a week or so to appear. After much prayer and a surgical procedure, I am healing very nicely. It will take many months more to completely close up my wound doctor says, however there is no pain and I am able to walk and carry on normally in my life. I have been lifted up and healed and thank God often for that.

There are approximately 25 verses in scripture that reference “the lame”. Jesus healed many people who had trouble in walking and standing.

***Luke 14:13-14** “But when you give a reception, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed, since they do not have the means to repay you; for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.”*

St. Marks has been blessed with memorial gifts that will help us offer hospitality to those who struggle with walking. Our new ramp will make it easier for those with a cane, a walker or wheelchair to enter the sanctuary to worship. This past year, Pastor has been hit and miss, at these meetings and would appreciate someone from St. Mark's to represent us. Alice Cassens is the current secretary, however we are 1 representative short of important voting on occasion. The next meeting is:

Tuesday July 24th 7:00pm at the Polo Church of the Brethren. Come, commit and serve. Not every community has such a blessing of Christian community as Polo. We are blessed.

Church Council Highlights July 2018

- **REPORTS:**

- **Pastor's Report:** Many meetings were held in June which is a good sign of faith in action. Pastor took 5 day vacation and spent 3 days of vacation in the hospital after a fall at church. There have been many doctor appointments, but pastor reports healing. Three couples are going through pre-marital planning.
- **Worship & Music:** The committee met June 8th and planned hymns through September. Upcoming special music includes Randy Hayes, playing his harp July 15th and Polo Dulcimer Group August 26th. We also appreciated Marla Buskohl playing recently. The Acker family offered to donate a piano to the church. Cheryl Goeking and Bob had the piano evaluated, discussed with the family and respectfully declined.
- **Education:** Lisa Hinrichs and Pastor Terrie will be meeting at the end of July to plan fall/winter curriculum. No Bible studies are planned for summer. Intern Michelle Knight has moved to Warren, Illinois to serve as she studies. Thank you to those who helped her move.
- **Worship & Hospitality:** The committee was called upon to help support the 150th Anniversary Celebration through both worship and hospitality. Reunion Sunday will be on September 9th. Plans are under way for doing special recognitions again this year. The hand fans have been obtained from the bank and have been put into use. Visitations were updated and new assignments were made of newly homebound members. A healing service is being planned for the 5th Sunday.
- **Global Mission:** Brad Long and Linda Gall are safely back from Romania. Tracey Anders will be going to Honduras soon. The committee is planning to designate \$100 for medical supplies in support of a young woman physician in honor of her graduation and who is also planning to stay in her remote village to help provide medical care.
- **Fellowship:** The annual Ice Cream Social was held June 24th. Bob applauded the Ice Cream Social efforts with many reporting the event was outstanding. Jeanne reported that discussion is underway for planning a church wide garage sale.
- **Property:** Oran Wilder recently discovered another plumbing issue in the parsonage in the downstairs bathroom. The plumber will be called to come and evaluate. A breaker box was changed out in the upstairs of the parsonage. The back door to the church has been realigned by Amanda Long and John Carroll. Thank you for the above mentioned in caring for our church property.
- **Council of Churches:** The next meeting is July 24th, 7 p.m. at Polo Church of the Brethren. We are always looking for more voting representatives to attend. If anyone member is interested, please contact Pastor.
- **Youth and Family Ministries:** The programs have been revised for the upcoming fall. An area confirmation program is still being planned along with our local classes.

- **Special Committees:**

- **Access Update:** Two poster displays have been prepared outlining the proposed work of Mark Piper, contractor with a diagram of the proposed ramp and stair lift. Both projects combined are estimated to cost less than \$12,000 collectively. The ramp estimate is \$4,754, the stair lift is \$6,460, and approximately \$200 for electrical work. A congregational meeting is planned on July 22, 2018 to vote on access recommendations.
- **150th Anniversary:** A committee was recently formed. Some ideas for celebration were; Christmas Eve 2019 Rededication of the church at worship (following previous celebration), Easter emphasis, BIG public celebration May 3, 2020 with the Bishop, August 7, 2020 Historical formation of St. Mark's Dinner for members. The plan is to have an outline of the celebrations by the January Annual Meeting 2019. Sign-up sheets will be forthcoming so that all members can be involved. The next committee meeting is August 17th at 10 a.m. at the church. The focus of this meeting will be sorting photos and memorabilia. All are welcomed to join.

- **New Business:**

- **Workman's Compensation:** A claim has been opened due to Pastor's recent fall at the church.

- **Other Business:**

- **Roast Beef Supper:** Tickets for the upcoming Roast Beef Supper are to be printed and disseminated by July 29th. A motion was put forth for the revenue generated from the Roast Beef Supper to be put toward the general fund. This was approved.
- Lori Christen will be taking some time off in November. Pastor will be looking for some additional assistance during this timeframe. Anyone interested in covering the absence should contact Pastor.

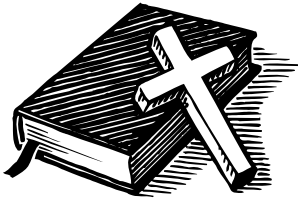
